A special meeting was called to order at 11:00 AM AM by Chairman Clyde Dethlefsen, with Roger Hanten,

## RESOLUTION FOR DECLARATION OF DISASTER JUNE 2024 FLOODING

WHEREAS unusually heavy rainfall during the dates of June 20 through June 22, 2024, has caused flood conditions in a majority of Aurora County;

WHEREAS said conditions have caused all waterways, streams, and tributaries to overflow;

WHEREAS said conditions have caused extensive flooding on county highways, township highways and city streets in the county, and has caused stress on the sewer system; and

WHEREAS said conditions have resulted in considerable economic hardship on the County and other units of local government; and

WHEREAS Aurora County and its citizens are in need of assistance from the State of South Dakota and the United States Of America in coping with the hardships resulting from such adverse conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Aurora County, as follows:

- 1. Aurora County is hereby declared to be in a state of disaster and emergency arising from flood conditions resulting from unusually heavy rainfall that occurred from June 20 to June 22, 2024;
- 2. The Board of County Commissioners requests that Aurora County be designated as a disaster area and as eligible for emergency and disaster assistance, by the Governor of the State of South Dakota and other appropriate authorities of the State of South Dakota and of the United States Government, and that its local governmental units be afforded the opportunity to participate in State and Federal disaster relief programs and benefits; and
- 3. That the Aurora County Auditor and Aurora County Emergency Manager are authorized and directed to communicate this declaration to the appropriate State and Federal authorities, and to interested parties, including the press.
