AURORA COUNTY COMMISSIONER PROCEEDINGS

October 3, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by Vice Chairman Travis Clark, with Randy Niles, Roger Hanten, and John Paul Studeny present. Absent was Clyde Dethlefsen.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

PUBLIC INPUT: Emergency Manager Kehn wanted the Commission to keep in mind how dry it is and be thinking about implementing a burn ban if conditions do not improve. This subject will be addressed again at the next meeting.

The agenda was amended by adding office closures and workshops for extension office, budget changes, and contract law for Stickney. A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Hanten, seconded by Niles to approve the minutes of the September 19th meeting. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to authorize the Auditor to make an operating transfer of \$20,000 from the General Fund into the Emergency Management Fund. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to hold an employee meeting with all employees on Thursday, November 21st beginning at 8:00 AM. Motion carried all voting aye.

Highway Superintendent Vissia and Secretary Beckman were present for the highway report. Also present was Greg Kroupa.

A motion was made by Hanten, seconded by Niles to approve an approach permit for Bill Folan on county road #38 for field access in the NE ¼ NW ¼ of 30-103-64. Motion carried all voting aye. The county will be responsible for the cost.

A motion was made by Hanten, seconded by Studeny to approve a right-of-way occupancy for Rustin Bruns to install a water line on county road #30 between sections 9 & 13 in 103-64. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Niles to approve payment to Contractor BX Civil & Construction in the amount of \$243,010.89 for Structure # 02-213-070 for Project BRO 8002(00)22-5, PCN 08WU. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Niles to approve and certify the county 5-year road plan. Motion carried all voting aye.

Greg Kroupa told the Commission that the county never should have signed off on the road agreement in 2010 after the wind farm was completed. He said the wind farm used red aggregate rock to fill in spots to fix the haul road. Greg said he has had several flat tires because of the sharp rocks and many others have too. It has never really been fixed and I cannot get anywhere with the wind farm because the township and commission signed off on it, said Kroupa. People will not drive or come in on that road because it has ruined so many tires. Kroupa told the Commission he has left messages with Superintendent Vissia telling him to put more gravel on it so it would stop ruining tires. Mr. Kroupa has talked with the manager from the wind farm about picking up the rocks that are causing the problems, but doesn't get anywhere with them. We are not going to get rid of the problem unless we get them picked up off the road or put more gravel down, said Kroupa. He told the Commission the township gravels very well and does not have any problems with those roads. The county receives quite a bit of money for the wind towers and could be using that money to help gravel that road, said Kroupa. Commissioner Clark told Kroupa that back in 2010, the road probably had a good amount of gravel on it when the commission signed off on the road agreement. Kroupa said there were culverts that were covered up by the gravel they put on, which has now been cleaned up. He offered to use his gravel at \$6/ton and his belly dump to put a good base of gravel on the road so the blade operator does not have to go too far down when blading so he doesn't dig aggregate rock up. He said he would only charge for the gravel at \$6/ton and supply his truck and labor free of charge. Doug was asked by Commissioner Clark when the last time the road was graveled. Doug replied the last time it was graveled was approximately 3-4 years ago. Doug also noted that the aggregate will work its way up because that's just its nature and there is a lot of red aggregate rock in that road that will keep working up. There is about a 7 mile stretch that will need to have a good supply of gravel on it. A motion was made by Niles, seconded by Hanten to have Greg Kroupa gravel approximately 7 miles of road with the gravel from his pit at \$6/ton with no charge for the hauling or labor. Motion carried all voting aye. A county maintainer will

need to be present when the gravel is being laid so it can be bladed evenly across the road for liability purposes. Commissioner Studeny asked if there are more roads that have this problem and was concerned about opening up a can of worms if we did this. It noted that this is the only area that has this issue. Kroupa and Superintendent Vissia will keep in touch.

Plankinton Service Club member Lindsey Weich told the Commission that they help with many community projects and would like the county's help in making a safe route for kids. Weich said the Service Club would like to provide a safe path from the pool to the ballfield and asked for the county for their support to help make this a reality. It was unsure as to whose road it is from the intersection of East Road and 1st Street out to the ball field. Superintendent Vissia said he can possibly find out from the State DOT. Weich said there are no specs drawn up as of yet, we just want to know if there is a good chance that this is something that could be done in a joint effort with the county. It was noted that providing a safe route is a good idea for the kids to use to keep them safe and off the road. Commissioner Studeny said he had contacted District III about safe routes and was told there is a program called the Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) with an 80/20 match. The deadline for this just passed on October 1st, so an application will need to be submitted next year. Studeny said a feasibility study will need to be done and Eric Ambroson from District III thought the project had a good chance of getting approved for the TAP grant. The Commission agreed that this was a good project and told Lindsey that the Service Club would have their support. The County will be updated once more information is gathered.

Commissioner Hanten informed Superintendent Vissia that Marv Jira had talk to him and asked if the highway department could put up more speed limit signs on Old Hwy 16 west of Plankinton and East of White Lake. He said Jira thought some think the speed limit is 65 mph and a few more signs would be a good reminder that it is only 55 mph. Vissia said that he would get some installed.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Niles to authorize Program Assistant Brandi Shroyer to attend a training in Brookings on November 14^{th} and to close the extension office on October 9^{th} and November $25^{th} - 27^{th}$ for personal reasons. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to sign the 2025 contract law agreement with the Town of Stickney. Motion carried all voting aye.

Auditor Urban informed the Commission that the 2025 provisional budget that was published had an error in the formula for the less 5% amount in the E-911 Fund as per SDCL 7-21-18. The following changes were made as follows: Increased general operating transfers by \$179 (\$379,652); general cash applied increased \$2,331 (\$524,891), general fund less 5% increase by \$125 (\$142,610); total general fund increased by \$2,379 (\$2,709,592), E-911 misc. revenue increased by \$179 (\$30,989); E-911 less 5% increased \$179 (\$3,049); total county budget increased \$2,379 (\$5,766,996). A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to accept and approve the changes to the 2025 budget. Motion carried all voting aye.

The Commission spoke with Custodian Dan Beckman about the bollard (security post) for the front sidewalk. It was noted at the last meeting that a motion was made to go with the original plan and have it put in the middle of the front sidewalk rather than along the sides. Dan said he understood the plan was changed so he could put in two bollards along the sides rather than the one in the middle. Commission Clark said that was almost a year ago and the plans are going back to the original one. Commissioner Studeny said he knows that Dan would like to have the two on the outer edges of the sidewalk to make snow removal easier, but the reasoning behind the one in the middle is to keep vehicles from driving on the sidewalk into the front door. Gregory County had that happen and we do not want that to happen here, said Studeny. We have a snow blower for the sidewalk that can be used for the walkway and to get around the security post, noted Studeny. The Commission told Dan the bollard needs to be put in the ground and cemented in. Vice Chairman Clark directed Dan to get this completed before the next meeting on October 17th and if he needs help with it, he should contact the highway department.

A motion was made by Hanten, seconded by Clark to file reports and pay voucher as listed below. Motion carried with Studeny and Niles each abstaining from their respective vouchers they presented for payment.
