AURORA COUNTY COMMISSIONER PROCEEDINGS

July 3, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by Chairman Clyde Dethlefsen, with John Paul Studeny, Roger Hanten, and Travis Clark present. Absent was Randy Niles.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

There was no public input.

The agenda was amended by adding Vanguard user training and district meeting for the Director of Equalization and chemical safety and compliance workshop for the weed supervisor. A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to approve the minutes of the June 19th meeting. Motion carried all voting aye.

Discussion was held on the burn ban. Due to the recent moisture the county has received, no action was taken to implement a ban at this time.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to authorize Chairman Dethlefsen to sign the 2026 Victim Services agreement through Beadle County for \$2,200. Motion carried all voting aye.

States Attorney Rachel Mairose discussed the trespassing signs that the Commission directed the highway department to put on the small triangle piece of land the county owns in the NE ¼ 30-105-65. Mairose told the Commission she did not think it was necessary. She understood that there was no fence line and asked how you would determine where to put the signs. If we wanted to do something, maybe we could lease or rent it out, that way the renter would assume any liability issues, said Mairose. It was noted that the small piece of land has been in the county's name since 1913 and there have not been any problems. It was the consensus of the Board to leave things as they are.

Highway Superintendent Vissia and Secretary Beckman were present for the highway report.

Superintendent Vissia informed the Commission that he can purchase a 2026 4x4 Dodge Ram pickup off the state bid from Wegner Auto for the same price as the 2025 4x4 pickup that the Commission approved back in February. The Board directed with him to proceed with the purchase for the 2026 pickup.

Jamie VanZee and Eric Prunty from Brosz Engineering were present to open bids for Project BRF 6119(00)25-2, PCN 0A6Y (Jackrabbit Bridge) pursuant to the notice that was published in the legal newspapers.

Emergency Manager Skyler Kehn met with the Board to go over his proposed 2026 budget.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to authorize Weed Supervisor Kehn to attend a workshop in Huron on July 23rd for a chemical safety and compliance workshop. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to authorize Emergency Manager Kehn to attend a crisis track training in Aberdeen on July 8th. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to authorize Emergency Manager Kehn to attend a regional training on August 6th in Yankton. Motion carried all voting aye.

Michelle Carpenter from Dakota Counseling Institute/Stepping Stones reported on the services they provide to county residents. She asked the County to continue our support of \$4,250 for 2026. The Commission thanked her for her time.

Jason Wolbrink, Scott Moeller, and Skyler Kehn representing each of the local fire departments met with the Commission to discuss how things were going for each of their departments and to seek continued support from the County for 2026. The Commission thanked them for their time.

Andrea Irwin from ROCS Transit presented the Commission with a report on the number of county residents that use the ROCS transportation program for various things. She asked the County for their continued support of \$7,000 for 2026. The Commission thanked her for her time and noted that it is nice to see that this program is being used by the residents of Aurora County.

Kaylene Goehring from ROCS Dining Services presented the Commission with the number of senior meals they help provide to our senior citizens in each of the communities within the county. Goehring asked the county to continue their support for the dining services in 2026 in the amount of \$7,290.00. Goehring stated that she is currently looking for someone to take over the senior meals program in Plankinton since the Commerce has changed owners.

Register of Deeds Arlene Koch reviewed her 2026 budget request with the Commission.

Director of Equalization Jessica Durrin reviewed her 2026 budget request with the Commission.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to authorize Jessica Durrin and Sam Simkins from the Director of Eqaulization office to attend a Vanguard software user meeting in Oacoma on August 19 & 20 and a district workshop in Mitchell on August 22nd. Motion carried all voting aye.

Sheriff Roman Briggs reviewed his 2026 budget request with the Commission.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to authorize extra hours for 4-H Program Assistant Brandi Shroyer so she can attend a 4-H Leader's meeting on July 14th to go over the final details for achievement days, July 28th to set up for achievement days, as well as August 1st & 2nd for the county achievement days. Motion carried all voting aye.

Brandi Shroyer presented the Board with a quote from Artisan Technologies LLC for a security camera at the Community/4-H Building. The cost of the camera, hard drive and installation is \$1,709.00. Shroyer informed the Commission that it is not NDAA approved, which is prohibited according to the State of SD Executive Order 2023-02. As per the Order, it prohibits government entities from purchasing goods or services from certain foreign governments, therefore, the County cannot accept the quote.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to enter into executive session at 11:50 AM with Auditor Urban as per SDCL 1-25-2(1) for personnel. Motion carried all voting aye. The Chairman declared the Commission out of executive session at 12:04 PM. A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to approve the FMLA request from Dan Beckmann. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to file reports and pay vouchers as listed below. Motion carried with Dethlefsen, Hanten and Clark voting aye. Studeny abstained from the vote.
