### **AURORA COUNTY COMMISSIONER PROCEEDINGS**

## July 20, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by Chairman Clyde Dethlefsen with Randy Niles, Roger Hanten, John Paul Studeny, and Travis Clark present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Input: Commissioner Clark reported he has received complaints about Lorang's not tarping their trucks.

Commissioner Hanten noted he has seen a motor grader dead-heading.

The tentative agenda was amended by adding software meeting for Director of Equalization and surplus Sheriff Tahoe's. A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to approve the minutes from the July 6<sup>th</sup> meeting. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to authorize Highway Secretary Nancy Beckman and someone from the Auditor and Treasurers offices to attend the county software user meeting on August 2<sup>nd</sup> in Pierre and Tina Gerlach from the Director of Equalization's office to attend the July 26<sup>th</sup> software meeting in Huron. Motion carried all voting aye.

Highway Superintendent Doug Vissia and Secretary Nancy Beckman were present for the highway report.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to approve a special overweight permit for Pies Contracting that was signed by the Chairman and Highway Superintendent on July 11<sup>th</sup>. Motion carried all voting aye.

Highway Superintendent Vissia informed the Commission he received the contaminated soil test results back and it is clear of any contamination. Some of the soil has been piled at the landfill already. Vissia noted the Plankinton elevator has dumped about 217 ton of contaminated soil this past weekend out there.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to authorize Highway Superintendent Vissia to attend a bridge preservation meeting in Deadwood on October 17-19. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to have the Chairman to sign the following resolution authorizing submission of an application for a Bridge Improvement Grant. Roll Call Vote: Clark, aye; Studeny, aye; Hanten, aye; Niles, aye; Dethlefsen, aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to authorize the Chairman to sign an agreement with BX Civil & Construction for project BRO 8002(00)22-5, PCN 08WU (Erickson Bridge). Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to authorize the Chairman to sign an agreement with BX Civil & Construction for project BRO 8002(00)22-4, PCN 08WT (Breukelman Bridge). Motion carried all voting aye.

Discussion was held on posting a slower speed for the Bridge by Storla.

Commissioner Studeny commented on the road closures today for the fog sealing that will be taking place and asked Doug how far in advance he knows about these types of things. Vissia said he knew about a day or so ahead of time. Studeny asked if he would let the emergency personnel or Emergency Manager Kehn know the next time this happens so they are aware in case they have an emergency call.

Commissioner Hanten told Superintendent Vissia that German is doing a nice job as blade operator in the White Lake area, but be needs to do a little better on the windrows along the side of the road. Hanten also said the Lake Road looks good, but it needs a couple loads of gravel. Vissia stated they have a lot of graveling to do yet. Hanten addressed the complaints he has had about dead-heading in the maintainer.

No applications have been taken out for the highway maintenance position.

Commissioner Hanten asked about why a county pickup needed to be at the shop in White Lake and stated that no other outlying shop has one. Superintendent Vissia did not see a problem with it. Chairman Dethlefsen said that once an employee is clocked in, they should not be driving their personal vehicle for liability reasons. Concerns were raised about the county's liability of having an employee driving their own vehicle after they are clocked in to work. The Commission directed Highway Superintendent Vissia to check with States Attorney Rachel Mairose on this.

SE Region Public Health Manager Julie Dykstra updated the Commission on the upcoming changes in the Department of Health. Also present was Public Health Assistant Ashley Howard and County Health Nurse Lacey Wieczorek. Julie reviewed the WIC caseload and Ashley's position as a Public Health Assistance. The Dept. of Health will be moving toward a team-based approach and there will not be a community health nurse stationed in every county anymore. The clients in Aurora County will see a nurse from the Team. There will be individuals who will only specialize or work with WIC while others will take care of the nursing aspects, etc. Julie said they are looking at the needs of each county and every county will be different. Dykstra informed the Commission that Lacey has taken a position as the School Health Coordinator for the State of SD. She will still work with the schools in Aurora County, but will no longer be the county health nurse for our county. The changes will happen this fall, said Dykstra.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to authorize Emergency Manager Kehn to sign a 3-year full-service maintenance agreement for the generators at the courthouse and the Community/4-H Building with Cummins. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Niles to authorize Emergency Manager Kehn to attend the annual SDEMA conference on September 11-14 in Deadwood. Motion carried all voting aye.

Emergency Manager Kehn updated the Commission on the LEMPG changes coming later this year.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to enter into executive session as per SDCL 1-25-2(1) for personnel at 10:58 AM. Motion carried all voting aye. The Chairman declared the Commission out of executive session at 11:11 AM with no official action taken.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to authorize the Chairman to sign a Deed Conveying Property Acquired by Tax Deed Proceeding to Taylen Trisco for the property Lot Twelve (12), Block Eight (8), Original Addition to the City of Plankinton, Aurora County, South Dakota. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Niles to authorize the Chairman to sign a Quit Claim Deed to Ronald W. Assmus, Jr., and Linda R. Assmus and their successors as Trustees of the Ronald W. Assmus, Jr., and Linda R. Assmus Joint Revocable Living Trust for the property North One Hundred Feet (N 100') of the West One Hundred Forty Feet (W 140') of Block Twenty-One (21), Milwaukee Land Company's Third Addition to the Town of Stickney, Aurora County, South Dakota. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to authorize the Chairman to sign a Deed Conveying Property Acquired by Tax Proceeding to Lori L. Chambers and her successor as trustee of the Keith L. Gerlach, Sr., Irrevocable Real Estate Trust for the property of a Portion of Block Twenty-one (21), Third Addition to the Town of Stickney, Aurora County, South Dakota, located in Section Thirty-One (31), Township One Hundred Two (102) North, Range Sixty-Three (63) West. Motion carried all voting aye.

Custodian Dan Beckmann requested permission to purchase some new trees to replace the dead ones in front of the courthouse. James Valley Nursery gave him a quote for a 10 ft. Hybrid Elm at a cost of \$380 installed. The next size down is roughly \$300 installed. The Commission directed the Auditor to have Dan get prices for evergreens

from Miller's farm right outside Plankinton as well as the cost of a Bur Oak and Maple tree from James Valley Nursery.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to declare surplus the 2017 Tahoe and 2015 Tahoe and add these two items to the surplus auction sale on the  $16^{th}$  of August. Motion carried all voting aye.

The remainder of the meeting was spent going over the 2024 proposed budget.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to file reports and pay vouchers as listed below. Motion carried all voting aye.
